Clean Stormwater Starts with Clean Streets



In urban areas, water that is released into the streets, gutters, and storm drains does not get treated before it reaches our local waterways. When water flows off our property after a storm, what's on our lawns, roads, buildings and parking lots flows with it. Meaning, any oil, litter, fertilizer and yard waste, can be picked up by excess water flow and end up in our creeks, streams, and lakes. Watching what we put on our property and in our storm drains can make our community, parks, and waterways cleaner and healthier. Here are some tips to help keep stormwater clean:

- Clean up pet waste
- Contain yard waste
- Properly care for pools and spas
- Never dump trash or household waste into storm drains
- Plant native plants
- Consider a rain barrel to collect rainwater for reuse in your yard
- Properly dispose of hazardous household waste

I hope you are doing well. I wanted to tell you about a few federal grants that our City has received for street projects. These grants will greatly contribute to improving the infrastructure and enhancing the quality of life for all of us in Moore.

- Check out the trail improvements that are ongoing at Veterans Memorial Park. The City received an 80/20 grant from the Oklahoma Recreational Trails Grant to fund this project.
- Telephone Road (between SW 19th and SW 34th): Utility work is occurring now for road reconstruction and widening, including necessary curb and guttering, storm drainage improvements, sidewalks, streetscape and utility line replacement.
- 4th Street underpass: This underpass is an important connection between different parts of our city. With the increased train traffic, the underpass will take a big step forward to ensure unerupted traffic flow. In addition to the GO Bond the city was able to secure federal and state grants to help with funding.

I want to assure you that our City staff is continually seeking other revenue sources to support various projects. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as your mayor and to be a part of such a great city. Together, we can continue to make Moore an even better place to live, work, and play.
