- Do not put disposable or flushable wipes down your toilet
- Dispose of grease and fats in your trash, not down the drain
- Plant your trees and large shrubs away from sewer lines-roots can cause damage to sewer lines
- The vast majority of the time, the backup is with the private line. If you call the City out first, 405-793-5080, we'll verify if the private line is blocked so you can get it fixed before it becomes a bigger issue.
