## Limit Your Impact on Stormwater Runoff during the Winter Months



Small changes can help keep waterways clean and free of debris. This helps reduce backups and flooding onto streets and yards. A few easy tips:

- Wash vehicles at a car wash where used water is recycled and does not generate runoff. The salt or brine from roads can impact our watershed if you wash your car off in your driveway.
- Do not dump or throw anything into swales or streams. Dumping grass clippings, leaves, trash, yard debris, etc., can accumulate and clog swales, culverts, and channels. Keep all swales clear of brush and debris.
- Pick up after your pet. Whether at home or out and about, pet waste needs to be scooped.
- Cover or store items that may contain pollutants. Avoid leaving any items outside that could release pollutants into the stormwater system or nearby waterways. This includes machinery and equipment, paints and stains, cleaning solutions, etc.
- Remove/secure items that can be carried by water flow or wind. Toys, sports equipment, and yard décor can make their way into stormwater conveyances and waterways. This can clog stormwater flow, contribute to pollution, cause damage and drainage issues.

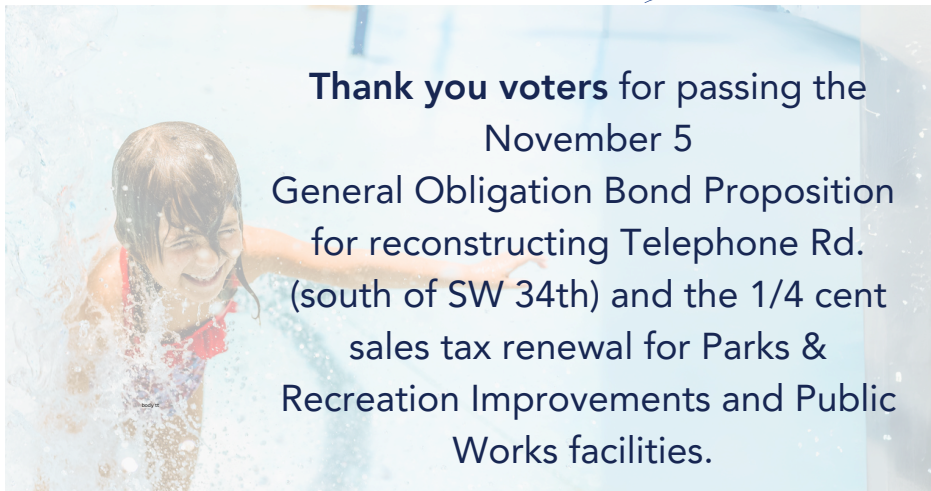
